Some of the awards we've received...

Jan 2010: AAT was one twenty winners across the UK of £500k in DECC Low Carbon Communities Challenge.

June 2010: AAT selected as one of five communities for £1million research programme, Evaloc, on low carbon communities led by Oxford Uni and Oxford Brookes.

Dec 2009: AAT won a £90k tender to deliver the Ynni'r Fro advice service in the South Wales valleys, advising community groups on wind, hydro and anaerobic projects.
